

EFFECTIVE EXAMINATION TECHNIQUE

agreat number of students finds it difficult to pass internal and external examinations. Some still fail or may perform below expectation even after burning the mid night oil. These are the ones that deserve our pity. If after swotting you still did not do well in your examinations, it might be about time you studied the techniques you have been using. The difference between an average student and a high flier often times lies in the examination techniques employed. Examinations are not passed by just swotting but

by examination techniques. In this piece, we shall be looking at some simple techniques developed by educational experts which, of course, have helped many students pass their examinations with excellent grades.

True, many books abound on examination techniques and some of these are good. It might even be possible that most of the students that fail or those that pass with the skin of their teeth do not know the existence of these books. Then, a large percentage of those who are aware of their existence do not read them or read them but do not apply the techniques suggested. Let me

repeat, examinations are not passed by swotting but by examination techniques. Examination technique is the attitude and method a student develops to help him study and master areas that would be set in examination papers in various subjects. Some of these techniques are ineffective and tend to derail students while some are very effective and give students the needed impetus to excel.

The techniques outlined here are directed toward Chemistry and Mathematics, but they can equally be applied to other subjects with excellent results. First and foremost is to develop a good study habit. A habit is something you do regularly without compunction. You must enjoy and relish studying.

This is because studying involves mental activity and also restricts you to a particular place for some time. A listless or hyperactive person may find it extremely difficult to study. Again, you must be able to distinguish between reading and studying. Reading is just one aspect of studying. Studying involves the use of the SQ3R (Surveying, Questioning, Reading, Reciting, and Reviewing). In studying, you must commit your brain, you eyes and your hands to work. That means, you must

concentrate or focus your attention to your study materials. You must not be distracted by music or movie and you must not stop your study to run an errand. You must scribble or draw or plot or jot or calculate or highlight as you study. In this way you commit your hands to work. You must question, agree with or refute a point of view as you study. In this way, you will always remember what you have studied.

Another aspect of examination techniques involves knowing the contents of the syllabus or scheme of work of each subject.

Ability to remember and recall

the topics of a scheme of work or syllabus of a particular subject goes a long way to helping you remember what you have studied.

Also, before the examination you must do well to acquaint yourself with what examiners look for in an answer booklet. You must understand that examiners use instructions to help you to decide the length and depth of your answer to a question. Yes, you must be familiar with the language of examination papers.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF THE EARTH STOPS SPINNING?
